FEDERAL DISASTER DECLARATION FACT SHEET

SEPTEMBER 15, 2017

Today, September 15, 2017, President Donald J. Trump issued a Major Disaster Declaration for the State of Georgia triggering the release of Federal funds to help people and communities recover from Hurricane Irma that began September 7, 2017, and continuing. Details of the disaster declaration and assistance programs are as follows:

Declaration Number: FEMA-4338-DR

Incident: Hurricane Irma

Incident Period: September 7, 2017, and continuing

Hazard Mitigation (HM): (Assistance for actions taken to prevent or reduce long term

All areas in the State of Georgia are eligible for HM-Designated Areas:

Additional designations may be made at a later date if requested by the State and warranted by the results of further damage assessments.
