Paul V. Stahlin is Regional President of Skylands Community Bank, a member of Fulton Financial Corporation. Prior to its merger with Skylands, he was President and CEO of Somerset Valley Bank.

He served as Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer of Fleet Credit Card Services, one of the ten largest credit card companies in the US. Prior to the acquisition by Fleet Financial, Paul was Corporate Controller of Summit Bancorp, one of the twenty-five largest bank holding companies in the country.
