Georgia Society of CPAs Presents Gold Key Awards

Atlanta, GA- The Georgia Society of Certified Public Accountants (GSCPA) and the Educational Foundation of the Georgia Society of CPAs recently recognized Hartley Burt of Marietta; Meredith Gould of Atlanta; and Gary Lee Mimbs, Jr., of McDonough, for achieving the highest score on the 2006 CPA Examination in Georgia. The awards were presented at a luncheon honoring new CPAs at the JW Marriott in Atlanta.

The Gold Key Award is the highest honor bestowed by the Educational Foundation, an extension of the Georgia Society which aids student education and research relating to the study, teaching, and practicing of accounting and related fields. In order to be considered for the Gold Key Award in any year, candidates will have to have completed testing in the previous calendar year, and earned the highest aggregate scores in passing all four sections of the Uniform CPA Examination on their first attempt.
